




The election of the officers and directors will be held at the regular meeting of the Milpitas Historical Society 7:00 pm on Wednesday, January 8, 2020.

February Installation Dinner

Instead of a regular meeting in February, the Milpitas Historical Society will hold its annual Officers and Directors Installation Dinner at the Summitpointe Golf Course Restaurant, 1500 Country Club Drive, Milpitas, CA on Thursday, February 20, at 6:30 pm. Our program for this event will be presented by Gregory Nokes, a journalist who has traveled the world as a reporter for the Associated Press and a historian whose previous books include: *Massacred for Gold: The Chinese in Hells Canyon* and *Breaking Chains: Slavery on Trial in the Oregon Territory.* He will speak about the subject of his new book, *The Troubled Life of Peter Burnett.*

Peter Burnett helped to organize the first major wagon train to the Oregon Country, was Oregon's first elected governor and fifth Supreme Judge of Oregon. He opened a wagon road from Oregon to California, worked with the young John Sutter to develop the new city of Sacramento and became California's first Governor. However, he resigned from most of his elected positions and was widely considered a failure at most of them. What was his problem?
