
The topic for this meeting will be San Jose's historic Japantown, one of only three remaining Japantowns, from its outgrowth from San Jose's last Chinatown through two world wars, the Depression, Internment, Resettlement, and then its gradual evolution into its present-day, ethnically diverse community.



Our presenters will be local authors Curt Fukuda and Ralph Pearce, authors of *San Jose Japantown: A Journey*. Published by the Japanese American Museum of San Jose, this book is the culmination of fifteen years of their research, photogathering, and writing.

The house, gardens, and outbuildings, shown in the film, have all been beautifully restored, inside and out.
