January 13 Meeting: The Architecture of Frank Delos Wolfe

Our first meeting of 2015 will be held at 7:00 pm on Wednesday, January 13, in the Auditorium (Community Room) of the Milpitas Library, 160 North Main Street.

Our speaker on this occasion will be Krista van Laan, author of a book about architect Frank Delos Wolfe (1862-1926) of San Jose, California. Wolfe was one of the most prolific architects of his time, popular with clients all over Northern California and respected by his peers, as was evident by his heavy coverage in national architectural trade magazines. For 35 years, Wolfe, with and without partners, made significant architectural contributions. Seven of his buildings are today on the National Register of Historic Places, and many others are city landmarks.



Wolfe was the architect of the 1916 Milpitas Grammar School that today is the anchor around which our Milpitas library was built, and he also designed the DeVries House across the street from the library.

Dedication of Mabel Mattos' Memorial Plaque

On Saturday, January 9 at 1:00 pm, at the Alviso Adobe Park, the Milpitas Historical Society will dedicate a memorial plaque to Mabel Mattos (1923-2013).

Mabel Mattos was one of the founding members of the Milpitas Historical Society and served at different times as newsletter co-publisher, Vice President, Hospitality Director, and Membership Director, as well being a beloved member of many other community organizations.

Mabel's family, the Silvas, moved to Milpitas in the 1930s from the Central Valley. Her family worked on the Downing Ranch for many years, then moved to a farm and orchard at the corner of Old Calaveras and Evans Road, where she lived with her husband, Henry Mattos, who died in early 2013.

The plaque will be mounted on a boulder next to the area of the park where the historic sycamore tree stands and where farm equipment donated by Mabel's family is displayed.

Little History Note: The giant pry bar held by Dan Cosper, lent for the occasion by Bob Keely, was from the original Falcato ranch, which was on N. Milpitas Blvd south of Dixon Landing Road near Jacklin (south of Washington St.). Falcato St. is named after one of the Falcato sons who died in WWII.
