May Meeting for Milpitas Historical Society

The next meeting of the Milpitas Historical Society will take place at 7:00 pm on Wednesday, May 9, in the Community Room (Auditorium) of the Milpitas Library, 160 North Main Street.



The presentation will be based on the history-making De Anza expedition of 1775-76, during which Juan Bautista de Anza led a party of over thirty travelers from Tubac Presidio, south of present-day Tucson, Arizona, all the way up to what is now San Francisco, a difficult journey of about thousand miles of largely unexplored country to locate the sites of the later established missions of San Francisco, Santa Clara, and San Jose.

Our presenters will be Charlie and Patty Kieffer, history fans who have been volunteers for Santa Cruz State Parks since 1989 and who have been heavily involved with the Friends of Santa Cruz State Parks, helping to restore the two-story hacienda in Watsonville known as the Castro Adobe.

They will give a power-point presentation and talk about the Anza Expedition and the Spanish/Mexican history of California from 1775 to 1850. The presentation will concentrate on the Spanish settlers and on how and when they came to California. Patty and Charlie will talk about the settlers' customs and lifestyles with an emphasis on the women settlers as well as talking about the Castro family, who came to California in 1775. Charlie is descended from the Castro family.

Meetings are free and all are welcome. Hope to see you there!

Fun Facts on Milpitas Parks

Know where Henry Strickroth Park is? It is on Jacklin Road, across the street from the Foothill Square shopping center, where the Nob Hill market is.

This park was named after a Milpitas resident who was one of the original Minute Men who joined together to fight off San Jose's attempt at annexation of Milpitas. Originally from Maryland, Henry Strickroth (1889-1982) was a retired UCSF college professor who

settled in Milpitas in the 1950's after the death of his wife, Elizabeth. He became an active and respected member of the community and was elected to the Milpitas School Board in 1952.

Along with Sal Cracolice, he brought about the Milpitas Youth Center, which later became the YMCA, and is now the Sal Cracolice Building.
