"Our Jewel in the Silicon Valley"

To what does this title refer? Come learn the answer at Milpitas Historical Society's next meeting, on Wednesday, May 11 at 7:00 pm in the Auditorium (Multipurpose Room) of the Milpitas Library, 160 North Main Street.

The program for this meeting will be a talk and film about "Agnews, Our Jewel in the Silicon Valley," by Kathleen Lee, a writer, filmmaker, and longtime volunteer coordinator at Agnews Hospital. She will tell us about the founding of the tiny former town called Agnews, which was incorporated into the city of Santa Clara in the 1980s, and how it came to be. The film will also provide the history of the institution first for the mentally ill and later for the developmentally disabled, for which it is best known.

The water tower at Agnews, (shown at left) is a familiar landmark. Agnews Develop-mental Center closed in 2009 and residents moved to other facilities. It was built by the California Conservation Corps under the direction of President Franklin D. Roosevelt in 1939. Please join us for this informative presentation about a little city that might be new to you. Meetings are free and all are welcome.

Visit to the Agnews Musuem

The Milpitas Historical Society has arranged another field trip, this one to visit the Agnews Historic Cemetery & Museum located at 1250 Hope Dr. on Friday, May 20, 1-2 pm. The State of California closed the Agnews State Hospital West Campus in 1995, at which time its brick Visitors Center building was moved to the cemetery site to be restored and turned into a Visitors Center for the cemetery that was newly renamed the Agnews Historic Cemetery. The Agnews Museum remembers the people who worked and lived at the "Hospital for the Chronic Insane," later the Agnews State Hospital and later still the Agnews Developmental Center from 1888 to 2009. Artifacts and photos of the past are displayed for the public to view. Continuing the Milpitas Park Name Saga

Last month, this newsletter reported that a park once slated to be named after **Captain Calvin Valpey**, (1806-1880) was instead going to be named for **O. H. P Vennum**, who was the first Justice of the Peace for Milpitas Township and a prominent farm owner.

However, in an unprecedented move, the city rejected the PRCRC's suggestion of the Vennum name and made the decision to name the park for **Larry Itliong** (1913-1977), a Filipino-American labor leader who was important in organizing Filipino farm labor.

Larry Itliong rose to prominence in 1965 when he was among the organizers of what became known as the Delano Grape Strike, which was one of the first times when Mexican and Filipino workers struck together. That strike brought about the creation of the United Farm

Itliong was one of the main people featured in the recently released film "The Delano Manongs," about the pivotal role Itliong and other Filipino leaders played in that important event, which was shown last October at the Milpitas Community Center. However, that was the only connection Itliong had with Milpitas.

Don't Miss This Year's International BBQ
