# Join Our Next Meeting on Wednesday, May 12

The Milpitas Historical Society hopes that you can join us at 7 pm on Wednesday, May 12, for our now-regular Zoom-hosted meeting. If you haven't yet used Zoom to attend one of our meetings, see the other side of this newsletter.

Our presenter for our May meeting is David Mariani, who has served on 27 corporate boards, including but not limited to private corporate boards, industry agency boards, and public boards. His professional career includes agri-business, real estate development, venture capital, and private and public banking.

In 2007, Mr. Mariani migrated back to his roots and founded Maristone, an herb-leafy-green fresh produce company; under his leadership, Maristone designed four different custom hydroponic growing systems and produced herbs under ¾ million square feet of glass. Mr. Mariani is currently developing a proprietary automated apiary system designed to assist apiarists to more efficiently manage and monitor bee colonies.

Mr. Mariani has authored two books, *Book of Wisdom*, and *Poverty of Affluence*. The latter book, about which he will be speaking, provides a history of Santa Clara Valley from the viewpoint of some of the early ranchers and land owners. The Marianis have been one of the seminal families in this Valley for five generations. His book takes us on a journey from the beginnings of Santa Clara Valley as the fruit basket of the world; the real estate boom of the '60s and '70s, right through to the computer age and the birth of Silicon Valley. The author weaves an entertaining, provocative and compelling story based on his personal experiences.

# The Stories of Milpitas Parks: Creighton Park



This newly improved park is named for the person who, in June 1855, constructed the first business building at a key intersection in Milpitas Township (where then Alviso Road eastward connected to Mission Road and where today Serra Way branches off from Calaveras Boulevard and soon connects to Main Street).

Frederick Creighton, of English birth and ancestry, was part of the migrant wave surging to Northern California shortly after the discovery of gold.

Creighton's store met numerous needs of early township residents: it was a saloon, it was a general store providing canned and dry goods of all sorts, and it was the first post office of Milpitas. Frederick Creighton served as Milpitas' first U.S. Postmaster for a decade, from June 1856 through May 1866.

The 5-acre park can be approached from the west via Dempsey Road into Richter Court or from the east via Park Victoria Blvd. down Olympic Drive. There are two additional access points as well: from the south, via the northern ends of either Big Bear Court or Matterhorn Court.

The park has lots of mature trees providing good shade on hot days as well as an expansive sunny green space for varied uses. Scattered about are simple benches for seating as well as tabled benches for leisurely eating of picnic food.

In the northern section of this recently upgraded park there is a large redesigned play-space with a wide range of equipment, including several types of climbing equipment, slides, and swings, all of which are installed on a foam surface to minimize injury from potential accidental falls. Very close by, there is a unisex bathroom that is a blessing for park-goers, especially those with smaller children. For pet owners, in what is rare for the more than thirty parks of the City, the upgraded Creighton Park's southern section has a fenced dog play-space with two enclosures – one specifically for small dogs and an adjacent one for large dogs.

Finally, there is a walking trail around the perimeter of the park for exercise as well as for interconnecting the different resources of the park.

Come enjoy this wonderfully "reimagined" park!


#### Membership
