

Alviso Adobe Finally Ready for Visitors Indoors!



On Wednesday, October 26, at 5 pm, a special ribbon-cutting ceremony will be held with our Mayor and City Council to celebrate the opening of the newly refurbished interior of Milpitas's iconic Alviso Adobe. The attending city dignitaries will then be given a special tour of the interior.

The Adobe's furnishings and displays have been under development for several years. When open to the public a few months from now, pre-scheduled reservations can be made with the EventBrite app or website. Guided tours of the interior will provide an immersive audio-visual experience of what adobe living was like during the mid-19th century, when it was built, as well as in the 1900s when the Cuciz family occupied it.

The slight delay in the opening for tours by the public is to ensure the AV presentations work as intended and to recruit and train more volunteer docents.
