Alviso Adobe Official Opening Takes Place!

After many years of planning and hard work, the City of Milpitas, which bought this property in 1997, was finally able to officially open the beautifully refurbished interior of the Alviso Adobe on Wednesday, October 26, at 5 pm. After a welcoming and introduction by City Manager Steve McHarris, Muwekma Ohlone Tribe Vice Chairwoman Monica Arellano welcomed the attendees and gave a land blessing in the Ohlone language as well as in English.
