

Next Meeting: September 18th at 7:00 pm

The next meeting of the Milpitas Historical Society will begin at 7 pm on Wednesday, September 11th, in the auditorium of the Milpitas Library, 160 N. Main Street.

The Presentation

During the months of December 2023 and January 2024, our presenter and Society member, Jathin Ullal, backpacked for six weeks in India and retraced the migration route that his forefathers took from today's Kashmir Valley and Nepal borders (in the north and northeast of India), west to Gujarat, and south to Goa, down to the southern tip of modern-day Karnataka - Ullal and Vithal, near Mangalore.



Jathin's 5,000-mile journey and time-tripping through 180 generations of his lineage brings vividly to life an amazing story. It sparkles with historic details as well as the nuances of the geography, languages, culture, and cuisine of India.

Jathin Ullal has been working as a global technical entrepreneur for the last thirty-four years in Silicon Valley and a resident of Milpitas. He is a member of the Milpitas Historical Society and is on its Board of Directors. Jathin is very generous with his time in support of our activities.

Milpitas High School Class of 1974 Reunion

This year, in the months leading up to the 50th anniversary of the Milpitas High School Graduating Class of 1974, Walter Armstrong of their reunion committee contacted the Society. He bought quantities of three different history books from the Society for their classmates who would be arriving from all over the United States in August. Later, this would develop into an unexpected and interesting project.

Class of 1974 and Society Collaboration

Debbie Shufelt, a member of the committee who now resides in North Carolina and is a graphic artist, was designing a floaty pen commemorating life in Milpitas and attendance at Milpitas High, but when it came time to order she discovered that the minmum quantity was 250 pens. The problem was that they didn't need nor could afford more than 100 pens.

Joe Ehardt thought the floaty pen was interesting and liked Debbie's design, so he had a conversation with Bill Hare about a possible collaboration with the reunion committee to produce a floaty pen that would commemorate the Class of 1974 and the Historical Society. Joe worked with Debbie to include additional artistic elements for what would become a two-sided floaty pen.



One side commemorates the Class of 1974 with a composite scene of Main Street Milpitas with some iconic stores of that era as background, over which would float a graphic element of the VW Beetle that they had built as a high school project. The other side would have the same background with a Leapin' Lena floating design element

The result -- a very cool souvenir for everyone!
